Study hard... rest hard... exercise hard... but keep it balanced.

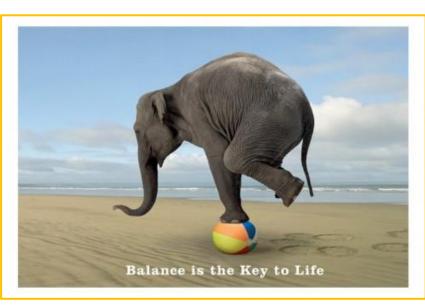

Weekly Wellbeing

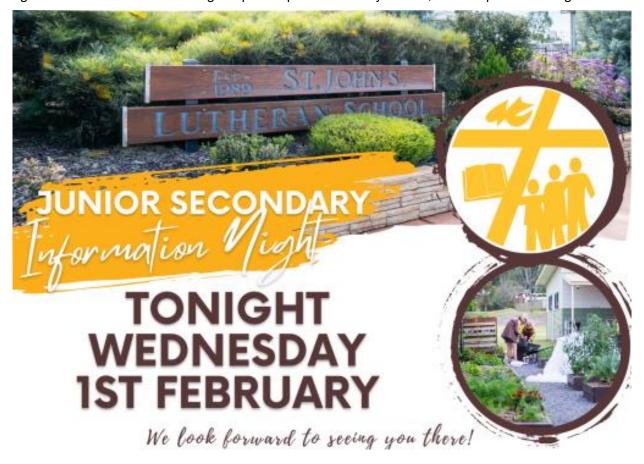

Music Notes!

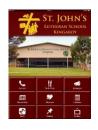

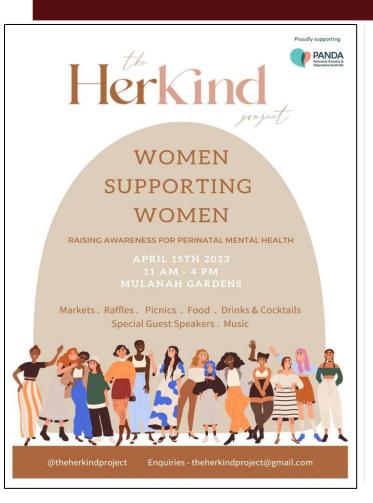
South Burnett Zone Under 12 Cricket

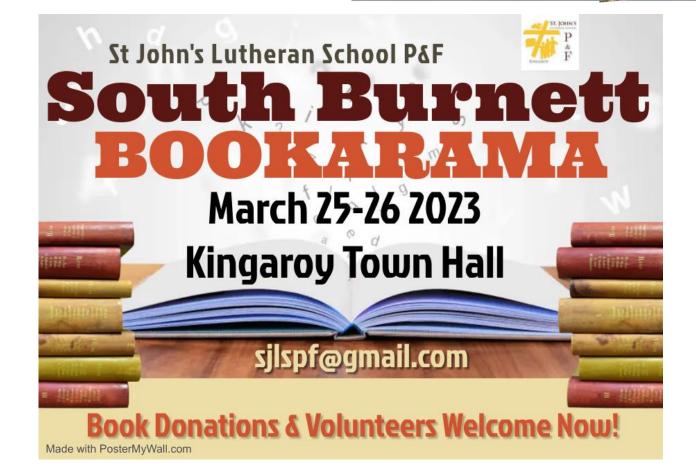

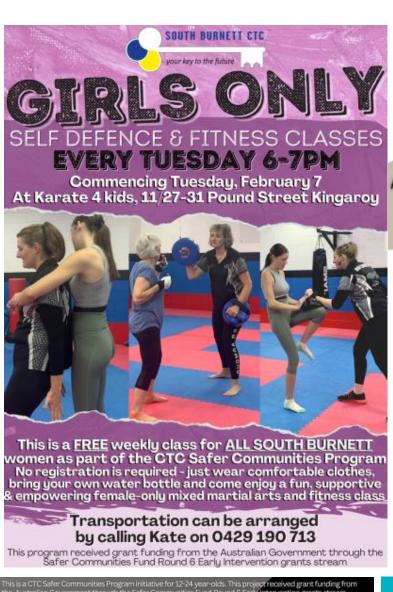
