


<u>Year 5N Maths</u> - In Maths, we have been doing a statistics project. After gathering their data, students used a spreadsheet to display their data in graphs.



1 Introduction

The South Burnett Musical Comedy Society (SBMCS) is excited to announce that Zoe Basham will be directing our production of **Annie Jr** alongside musical director and choreographer Sue Dowideit-Reiger. This Creative Team has extensive experience within the performing arts as well as working with young people both on and off stage.

Based on the popular Tony-winning musical Annie, this condensed show features a wonderful score written by Charles Strouse and Martin Charnin, including the smash hit, "Tomorrow".

With a combination of street-smarts and optimism, Annie warms the hearts of the audience as we witness her rise from next-to-nothing in New York City. Determined to find her parents, who left her alone years ago, she does her best to comfort the children at the orphanage who have no family but each other. Although things don't quite work out how Annie has planned, she uses her imagination and quick-wit to thwart the plans of the evil Miss Hannigan and find a new family with billionaire Oliver Warbucks, secretary Grace Farrell, and her lovable pooch, Sandy.

2 Vision

Throughout a series of workshops, our Creative Team will provide opportunities for all participants to explore the various characters and songs from the hit musical Annie. These workshops will focus on and facilitate learning around a range of stagecraft skills including: ensemble building, characterisation, singing, dancing, costume design, set and prop creation, and more. Our plan is to start off with an 'intensive' workshop weekend in late July, then come together once a week during term 3, followed by an intensive 'polishing' period during the September School holidays so we can show off our hard work in three intimate performances.

As a new, experimental venture, the format of this Youth Theatre Project is a little different to other productions staged by SBMCS in the past. Some things to note include:

- Instead of holding auditions prior to rehearsals, roles will be cast over the workshop process - this will allow all participants the chance to 'try on' various characters before the Creative Team selects the individuals most appropriate for the roles.
- To compliment this flexible casting model, there is a possibility each of the three shows will have completely different ensembles - this means participants get to practice and perform in a wider range of roles, expanding their skills even further.
- The final production will be presented 'in the Round' as opposed to on a traditional stage, providing a new format for the performers and audience to explore and enjoy.
- While the 'setting' of this adaptation of Annie Jr is still New York City, the costumes and staging have been modernised to reflect a more contemporary interpretation.

Please come along to one of two information sessions to meet the Creative Team, gather further information on the project, and return the necessary sign-up forms. These sessions will be held in the Dance Room at Kingaroy State High School on Saturday 1st July at 2pm, and Thursday 6th July at 7pm.
